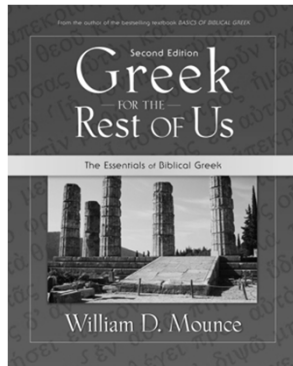

 15 When they had finished eating, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?" "Yes, Lord," he said, "you know that I love you." Jesus said, "Feed my lambs." 16 Again Jesus said, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" He answered, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus said, "Take care of my sheep." 17 The third time he said to him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" Peter was hurt because Jesus asked him the third time, "Do you love me?" He said, "Lord, you know all things; you know that I love you." Jesus said, "Feed my sheep."

- Using your Bible, Reverse Interlinear, and Exegetical Dictionary if needed answer the following questions:
- 1) In Jesus' first question, Jesus asks "Do you love me more than these?" Who or what are "these?"
  - 2) Jesus asks Peter three times, "do you love me." What more can you find in the Greek? Is there relevance in this change?
  - 3) Peter answers three times, "you know that I love you." What more is expressed in the Greek? Is there relevance to this change.
  - 4) In Jesus' response to Peter's answers he uses 2 words: Feed, and Tend. What are the original words, and how do their meanings compare?
