| 3000 | The Archaic Period First and Second Dynasties | | |
| | | | Development of true urban centers (Arad, Ai, Jericho); massive walled cities; trade with Egypt and the Sinai; some cities (Arad, Ai) abandoned or destroyed about 2750, but others were rebuilt or newly founded (Hazor) in the Early Bronze III era (2750–2200) |

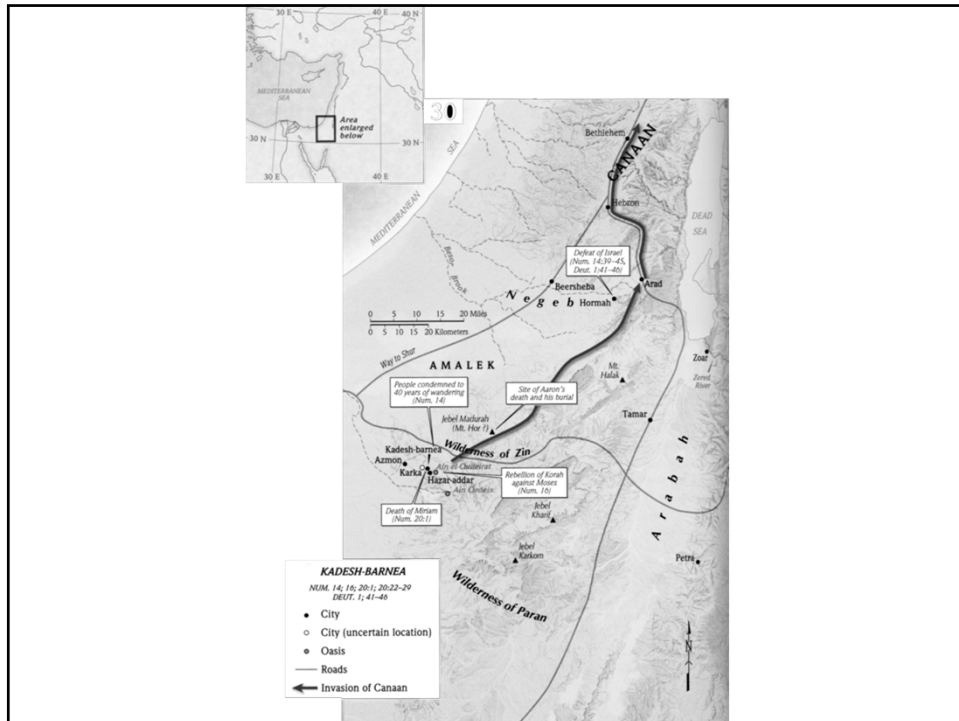
